
Building Capacity to Improve Health Outcomes During Pregnancy

Syphilis is a growing concern in NJ

Cases of syphilis among women in NJ have been on the rise leading to a resurgence of congenital syphilis cases in our state.

Increase in acquired syphilis

(with a sharp incline since 2016)



Increase in congenital syphilis

(despite decreases in 2022-2023)

Why is this critical?





The Fetal and Infant Mortality Review - HIV & Congenital Syphilis (FIMR - HIV & CS) Methodology

This methodology is designed to improve perinatal HIV & congenital syphilis prevention systems. It is a community-driven process to improve care. The Case Review Team and Community Action Team help to facilitate this process.

Advocate for change in the syphilis screening law to ensure timely diagnosis and treatment.


