To confirm a positive result, a complete syphilis test includes




RPR (Rapid Plasma Reagin)



Treponemal test (e.g., FTA, TPPA)

Universal third trimester screening is now recommended for all pregnant people.



Testing Protocol

Ensure electronic health record (EHR) lab orders include "reflex to confirmatory" to avoid delays.
